Interpretation of Achievement Scale – Foundations Level 0

The goals of Foundations are to provide students with the basic foundation of communication in the English language, to improve listening comprehension as it related to vocabulary recognition and basic grammatical structures, and to increase awareness of basic sentence structure and reading comprehension. By the end of Foundations Level 0, students will be able to:

--Demonstrate a basic knowledge of English communication. (R0.1-R.07; W0.1-W0.7; LS0.1-LS0.12)

Foundations Level 0 Teaching Objectives:

1. Develop students' ability in basic listening and speaking communication skills:
Pre-Midterm
 - 1.1. Say the name of each letter in the alphabet and numbers one through twenty in sequence.
 - 1.2. Produce the basic sounds of each letter in the alphabet.
 - 1.3. Say the days of the week and months of the year in sequence.
 - 1.4. State personal information and produce spoken introductions and greetings.
 - 1.5. Ask and answer simple questions.
 - 1.6. Engage in simple conversations.
 - 1.7. Produce simple descriptions.
 - 1.8. Ask and answer questions about daily activities.**Post-Midterm**
 - 1.9. Identify the syllables in a spoken word.
 - 1.10. Produce detailed descriptions using adjectives, size and location.
 - 1.11. Ask and answer questions about future plans.
 - 1.12. Ask and answer questions about past actions

 - 2.1. Identify word meaning.
 - 2.2. Use pictorial and context clues to determine word meaning.
 - 2.3. Elicit comprehension through the title.
 - 2.4. Use mechanics to interpret a reading.
 - 2.5. Write alphabet in upper and lower case.
 - 2.6. Write and spell numbers and dates.
 - 2.7. Use capitalization and periods.
 - 2.8. Write a basic sentence.
 - 2.9. Write an absence note.**Post-Midterm**
 - 2.10. Identify the topic of the passage.
 - 2.11. Skim for the main idea.
 - 2.12. Look for examples of the main idea.
 - 2.13. Scan the text for details.
 - 2.14. Recognize transition signals.
 - 2.15. Write a basic (five sentences) descriptive paragraph.
 - 2.16. Write a basic (five sentences) expository paragraph.
