



Course Objectives, Student Learning Outcomes, and Promotion Requirements

Interpretation of Achievement Scale – Aviation English Levels 5-8

Aviation English aims for students to build confidence in communication skills necessary to function effectively in the aeronautical community. The course familiarizes students with terminologies and phrases specific to aviation industry as well as providing a context for English needed for communication between aviation professionals. The main focus is on the language skills needed to communicate in routine/non-routine and/or emergency situations during flight operations. The students will expand their aviation-specific vocabulary when interacting in aviation environment scenarios and case studies.

By the end of Aviation English, students will be able to:

- demonstrate proficiency in industry-specific communication skills in real time
- apply the different skills entwined with aviation communication practices to a simulated situation.

Aviation English Objectives:

1. Improve comprehension, vocabulary, grammar & interactive listening skills with regard to flight operations:
 - 1.1 Listen for linguistic and cultural subtleties
 - 1.2. Record information accurately
 - 1.3. Understand texts in the field of Aviation
 - 1.4. Understand and clarify when misunderstandings occur
 - 1.5. Listen for aviation terminology
 - 1.6. Recognize a speaker’s tone
 - 1.7. Understand cause and effect relationships
2. Develop students’ abilities in oral communication skills:
 - 2.1. Use appropriate discourse markers and connectors
 - 2.2. Respond to verbal and non-verbal cues appropriately
 - 2.3. Form basic and complex grammatical structures and well-controlled sentence patterns
 - 2.4. Express necessity, difficulty and intentions
 - 2.5. Identify and respond to problems
 - 2.6. Describe actions and position
 - 2.7. Ask for clarification when discussing Aviation topics
 - 2.8. Summarize and report
 - 2.9. Stress effectively key words.
 - 2.10 Give clear instructions
 - 2.11 Vary speech flow to emphasize a point
 - 2.12 Utilize clarification strategies when unusual and unexpected situations create confusion
