Interpretation of Achievement Scale – Cinema and Culture

Cinema and Culture offers a foundation for understanding American cinema and its relation to culture and history. The goal of this course is to develop ESL students' knowledge and skills in cinema studies, critical thinking, persuasive and creative writing, and oral presentations. This course is designed for mid-level students who seek to improve and refine their critical reading, academic writing and oral communication skills through film analysis.

Cinema and Culture Objectives:

- 1. Develop students' critical thinking skills about films
 - 1.1. Analyze themes
 - 1.2. Detect point of view, bias and tone
- 2. Develop students' vocabulary of common concepts and words in film studies
 - 2.1. Utilize situation-specific vocabulary in composing film response journals
 - 2.2. Utilize concepts and terms of the film genres effectively in oral/written film analysis

3. Develop students' oral presentation skills

3.1. Utilize debate and discussion etiquette
