#### CONSIDERATIONS

A total of six (6) applicants will be selected for the Lewis Foundation Undergraduate Scholarship award for Spring 2026.

Selected applicants will be given a time period to accept the award upon notification; in the event of decline (or non-reply), alternate, qualified awardees may be selected.

Awardees will be considered tentative until UCF admission and enrollment is verified.

**Please note:** The Lewis Foundation Undergraduate Scholarship may be used for fall and spring semesters only (it cannot be awarded for summer semesters).

The Lewis Foundation Undergraduate Scholarship will be available to newly admitted UCF applicants and current students. Bahamian students will have to fill out our Lewis Foundation Undergraduate Scholarship Application at https://go.ucf.edu/LFSUDG before the application period closes.

## CRITERIA

To be eligible to apply for "The Lewis Foundation Undergraduate Scholarship", the following criteria must be met:

- » Applicants must be citizens coming from the Bahamas and must have graduated from a high school located in the Bahamas.
- » Applicants must demonstrate financial need through supporting documentation.
- » Applicants must demonstrate and maintain good academic standing. (3.0 GPA).
- » Awarded students must be enrolled full time in a bachelor's degree program. (12 credits)
- » Awarded students must have a current and valid immigration status.
