Interpretation of Achievement Scale – Introduction to Academic Reading Level 3

The goals of Introduction to Academic Reading Level 3 are for students to build pre-academic reading skills by exposing students to multi-paragraphed readings with high-frequency vocabulary.

Introduction to Academic Reading Level 3 Teaching Objectives:

- 1. Demonstrating general recognition of a simple academic reading passage through class discussions, comprehension questions and assessments.
- 2. Skimming and scanning for the main idea and details of a simple academic reading passage.
- 3. Making simple inferences and drawing basic conclusions in simple academic reading passages.
- 4. Identifying specific information related to time and chronology.
- 5. Summarizing the main idea of simple academic reading passages.
- 6. Identifying the meaning of new words through context.
- 7. Analyzing a short text about everyday activities.
- 8. Analyzing simple descriptions of physical appearance.
- 9. Extracting specific information from simple academic reading passages and using this information to answer comprehension questions.
- 10. Comparing visual images to information given in simple academic reading passages.
- 11. Previewing and predicting the main idea of a simple academic reading passage using headings and pictures.
- 12. Summarizing simple academic reading passage through multi-sentence written responses.
