Interpretation of Achievement Scale - Introduction to Academic Reading Level 4

The goals of Reading Level 4 are to expose students to a wide variety of emerging academic texts while increasing their ability to analyze and synthesize information.

Introduction to Academic Reading Level 4 Teaching Objectives:

- 1. Demonstrating comprehension of a reading passage through class discussions, comprehension questions and assessments
- 2. Skimming for the main idea of an academic reading passage at the A2+ Level
- 3. Scanning for specific information in an academic reading passage at the A2+ Level
- 4. Previewing an academic reading passage at the A2+ Level by looking at the title, headings, and images
- 5. Making simple inferences of unstated information
- 6. Drawing conclusions from information in an academic reading passage at the A2+ Level
- 7. Summarizing an academic reading at the A2+ Level in writing
- 8. Identifying supporting ideas
- 9. Distinguishing between facts and opinions
- 10. Distinguishing between causes and effects
- 11. Identifying the meaning of new words through context
- 12. Following a basic sequence of events in an academic reading passage at the A2+ Level.
- 13. Identifying basic similarities and differences in the facts between two academic readings at the A2+ Level on the same familiar topic, if supported by pictures and questions.
- 14. Identifying basic opinions expressed in simple language in a short reading passage.
- 15. Making basic inferences from simple information in an academic reading passage at the A2+ Level.
- 16. Extracting key information from an academic reading passage at the A2+ Level, if guided by questions.
- 17. Identifying information on a variety of topics in an academic reading passage at the A2+ Level.
- 18. Identifying the main topic and related ideas in an academic reading passage at the A2+ Level.
- 19. Analyzing simple diagrams (e.g. graphs, bar charts).

- 4. Identify context clues in a reading passage at the A2+ level to determine the meaning of unknown vocabulary
- 5. Identify the organizational structure of a reading passage at the A2+ level
- 6. Acquire and utilize vocabulary at the A2+ level.
