Course Objectives, Student Learning Outcomes, and Promotion Requirements

Interpretation of Achievement Scale – Introduction to Academic Writing Level 4

The goal of Introduction to Academic Writing Level 4 is for students to continue to develop paragraph writing skills on familiar topics.

Introduction to Academic Writing Level 4 Teaching Objectives:

- 1. Apply the paragraph writing process
 - a. Brainstorming and paragraph outlining skills
 - b. Paragraph construction (e.g., definition, process, descriptive, opinion, narrative, response, comparison and contrast).
- 2. Identify the component parts of paragraph cohesion:
 - a. Apply the constructs of a paragraph: topic sentence, supporting sentences, and a concluding sentence.
 - b. Distinguish between major and minor supporting details
 - i. Identify and use major and minor supporting details in a paragraph.
 - ii. Identify and use transition words for major and minor details appropriate to the paragraph type (in addition, next, while, on the one/other hand, furthermore, etc.)
- 3. Demonstrate a developing grammatical range in writing.
 - a. Use a mixture of simple, compound, and complex sentences in a single paragraph.
 - b. Use adverb clauses of time
 - c. Recognize and apply if clauses and reason clauses.
 - d. Recognize and apply modals to express ability and possibility, advice and suggestions, and necessity.
- 4. Apply punctuation rules to complex sentences and paragraph transitions.
- 5. Apply proper paragraph formatting skills (i.e. by using headers, centering titles, utilizing margins, spacing and indenting).
- 6. Write about a controlled topic at this level. See the list below:
 - a. Short, basic descriptions of places, people, objects, or experiences.
 - i. Basic comparisons between people, places, or things
 - ii. Short, simple descriptions of people's physical appearance, past or present job, or everyday personal experiences.
 - iii. Short texts describing favorite objects, possessions, or household pets.
 - iv. Short description of familiar activities, everyday matters, and simple processes or instructions
 - v. Short texts about likes and dislikes with explanations
 - vi. Simple texts giving key information about their culture (e.g., food, national holidays, festivals)
 - b. Simple story or descriptions of an event using basic time expressions:
 - i. A past event or activity
 - ii. A future trip or event

Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. Construct a developed paragraph (minimum 10 sentences) on a familiar topic.
- 2. Demonstrate the writing process through planning, writing, and rewriting a short paragraph by utilizing feedback from instructor and peers.
- 3. Express recognition of topic development through using major and minor details as well as basic connectors appropriate for the paragraph type.
- 4. Structure paragraphs with mixture of simple, compound, and complex sentences.
- 5. Compose a variety of complex sentences including time clauses, if clauses, and reason clauses.
- 6. Integrate A2+ vocabulary into writing.
