## Course Objectives, Student Learning Outcomes, and Promotion Requirements

### Interpretation of Achievement Scale - Academic Writing Level 6

The goal of Academic Writing Level 6 is to help students develop multi-paragraph essay writing skills on a range of rhetorical patterns.

### **Academic Writing Level 6 Teaching Objectives:**

- 1. Apply the multi-paragraph essay writing process in both timed and untimed situations
  - a. brainstorming and outlining skills
  - b. 4-5 paragraph essay construction (i.e., descriptive, classification, compare/contrast).
  - c. self and peer-editing and feedback skills in addition to instructor feedback (punctuation, formatting, spelling, grammatical accuracy, vocabulary use, etc.)
  - d. incorporate feedback in successive drafts
- 2. Apply multi-paragraph essay structure to an academic topic and appropriate rhetorical pattern, demonstrating cohesion and coherence:
  - a. demonstrate essay structure and formatting in writing
    - write an introduction paragraph with a thesis statement
    - write 2-3 body paragraphs, applying major and minor details
    - write a concluding paragraph
    - identify and use transition words appropriate for the rhetorical pattern
  - b. Produce descriptive 4-5 paragraph essays.
  - c. Produce classification 4-5 paragraph essays.
  - d. Produce compare/contrast 4-5 paragraph essays.
- 3. Demonstrate an emergent academic language use on a variety of topics.
  - a. Identify and use passive and active voice
  - b. Identify and use adjective and noun clauses
- 4. Write about a controlled topic at this level. See the list below:
  - a. Write short, simple biographies about real or imaginary people
  - b. Write about a real or imagined event
  - c. Tell a story or describe an event with details
  - d. Write a review of a film, book, TV program, blog, or game
  - e. Summarize main information from simple diagrams (e.g., bar charts, graphs, tables)
  - f. Write about an opinion using detailed reasoning and examples, arguments and counterarguments

Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. Compose a multi-paragraph text (4-5 paragraphs) on an academic topic following North American conventions in each of these rhetorical modes: descriptive, classification, and compare/contrast
- 2. Employ strategies to develop writing processes through planning, writing, and editing 4-5 paragraph essays.
- 3. Evaluate and reorganize compositions by employing revision and editing strategies that show global and local improvement
- 4. Integrate instructor and peer feedback into compositions
- 5. Integrate B1+ grammatical structures and vocabulary in written texts.
