**Course Objectives, Student Learning Outcomes, and Promotion Requirements** 

### Achievement Scale - Foundational Communication Skills Level 1

The goal of Foundational Communication Skills Level 1 is to expose students to everyday vocabulary while building foundational listening and speaking skills.

### Foundational Communication Skills Level 1 Teaching Objectives:

- 1. Pronounce the sounds of English with practiced words and phrases
- 2. Distinguish between consonant and vowel sounds
- 3. Develop sound-spelling correspondence awareness for common, practiced words
- 4. Recognize contractions with the verb be
- 5. Identify and respond to common greetings and salutations
- 6. Identify and respond to everyday classroom instructions
- 7. Identify and respond to yes/no questions and wh-questions on personal and social situations.
- 8. Identify the main ideas and critical details in level-appropriate listening passages.
- 9. Ask for and provide personal information, including addresses and telephone numbers, in short conversations.
- 10. Identify and share information on everyday regular activities related to school.
- 11. Provide information regarding how one is feeling, and what one is doing.
- 12. Identify the names of people and places from short conversations.
- 13. Distinguish between can and can't in a listening.
- 14. Express likes and dislikes.
- 15. Ask for and give the day, date, and time.

## Foundational Communication Skills Level 1 Student Learning Outcomes to Formally Assess:

Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. Recall and state main ideas and details on a listening or live conversation related to personal and social situations at an A1 level.
- 2. Select correct vocabulary and structures to respond to questions.
- 3. Provide a personal introduction, using familiar, everyday vocabulary.
- 4. Identify implied meanings and infer the speaker's intentions in level-appropriate listening passages.
- 5. Identify letter/sound correspondence (phonemic awareness).
