## Course Objectives, Student Learning Outcomes, and Promotion Requirements

## Interpretation of Achievement Scale - Academic Communication Skills Level 6

The goal of Academic Communication Skills Level 6 is for students to build upon their communication abilities to achieve in-depth listening comprehension skills for both academic and everyday conversation, further developing communication strategies for lectures, discussions, impromptu speech, and academic presentations.

## **Academic Communication Skills Level 6 Teaching Objectives:**

- 1. Categorize rhetorical patterns. E.g. Compare/contrast, cause/effect, classification, etc.
- 2. Identify and demonstrate the register difference between academic language and everyday language
- 3. Distinguish between facts and opinions.
- 4. Apply note-taking strategies (e.g., abbreviations, symbols).
- 5. Identify main ideas of lectures with support of notes.
- 6. Demonstrate in-depth comprehension of listening passages through group discussion.
- 7. Use signal words to mark transitions.
- 8. Identify problems and offer informed solutions.
- 9. Express agreement and disagreement and provide reasons.
- 10. Express ideas in an impromptu manner.
- 11. Prepare a structured presentation that uses discourse markers to organize main points
- 12. Demonstrate active listening strategies by asking follow-up questions.
- 13. Use thought groups when speaking
- 14. Participate in informal discussions on familiar topics with little repetition.
- 15. Ask and answer follow-up questions on what was heard.
- 16. Show interest in conversation
- 17. Describe past, present, and future plans
- 18. Provide and identify reasons and explanations.

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## **Academic Communication Skills Level 6 Student Learning Outcomes to Formally Assess:**

Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. Prepare and deliver an academic presentation, stating and supporting opinions.
- 2. State opinions and respond to others' opinions in a discussion.
- 3. Identify main ideas, supporting ideas and details of a lecture at the B1+ level with support from notes.
- 4. Determine the meaning of key vocabulary words in a listening passage.
- 5. Identify implied meanings and infer the speaker's intentions and opinions in level-appropriate listening passages.
- 6. Produce sufficiently developed arguments and counterarguments for impromptu academic topics.

## **Academic Communication Skills Level 6 Requirements for Promotion**
